



WIOA President's Message 2007

Welcome everyone, to the 70th Victorian Water Industry Engineers & Operators Conference.

The 2007 year is shaping up as very significant in the history of WIOA nationally. It has been very exciting and rewarding to be able to deliver quality event and services to “operations” people in Qld and Victoria and to recently be able to spread our wings into NSW and WA as well. The people in these States have embraced the concepts of what WIOA has on offer and our Membership numbers and supporter base has grown significantly as a result of our increased presence around the country.

In looking at this, the 70th staging of the Victorian conference, it is important to keep our message going out strongly in Victoria as well. We know that many of you are Members of WIOA already but there is a significant number of you who are not. We would therefore like to take this opportunity to introduce you to the Association and what we are all about. We do this by bringing people together to share the latest information about processes and technologies at events like this, by running other special interest seminars such as our Media Filters, Distribution system or PAC workshops, by producing useful operational resources such as our “Practical Guide” series, by placing information onto our website for all operators to access and by being proactively involved in the development and implementation of the Water Training Package and its associated resource material. We have recently assisted to promote the industry by developing career videos in an effort to attract young people into the industry in the future. We also produce our own Journal and a number of other Member focused publications. There is a sample pack showcasing the various WIOA publications in your satchel and for an annual membership fee of only \$20, we think it is great value and we encourage everyone to join.

Enough of the PR stuff and back to this event. As usual we have heaps of people to thank for organising this event.
