The Water Industry Reference Committee (IRC) at its meeting on 11 August received and accepted the final report and all the proposed amendments from the **review of the qualification rules and units of Competence in Certificate IV** in the National Water Training Package. The amendments will now be forwarded to the various State Training Authorities for their review. It is anticipated that the updated material will be forwarded to the Australian Industry and Skills Committee for their final endorsement in October.
