AROUND THE TRAPS

The WIOA Committee has confirmed that the 2021 Individual Membership fees will increase to \$40 and the Corporate Membership fee will increase to \$300 (both GST included). The financial impact of COVID-19 on WIOA has been dramatic with all events cancelled in 2020. Conferences and events have been the main source of income for WIOA for many years and have subsidised the annual membership fees, allowing us to keep them low. The modest increase in fees is necessary to help keep the organisation sustainable. Invoices will be sent to all Members shortly, with payment due on 1 January 2021.



The Water Services Association of Australia (WSAA) has launched the **Transitioning the Water Industry with the Circular Economy** paper to help guide water utilities to unlock the circular economy to better manage resources, make and use products and to regenerate natural systems. A water documentary **Brave Blue World** will be available to watch on Netflix on 21 October 2020. Narrated by Liam Neeson and featuring actors and activists Matt Damon and Jaden Smith, Brave Blue World is a not-for-profit foundation focused on providing a platform for scientific educational storytelling and public engagement. The foundation was created to inspire a shift in thinking and solve water challenges globally. The documentary shows the scale and urgency of the global water crisis and the many pioneering solutions. The message is that if we respond to the calls to action highlighted in the film, we will solve water in our lifetime.



The new Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Communications has released a consultation paper on proposed amendments to the **Code of Practice underpinning the Telco powers and immunities**. It covers a number of the key items that the water industry has been looking to have addressed, such as good structural reviews prior to implementation, and moving Telcos onto monopolies etc. It is calling for costs and benefits. WSAA is leading a project to gather as much cost data as possible from water utilities to build on previous submissions.
