SPECIAL NOTICE TO CORPORATE MEMBERS: The 2021 WIOA Queensland, Victorian and New South Wales Conferences and Exhibitions have been included in Austrade's Approved Business Event list giving our Corporate Members an opportunity to apply for a grant to recover some costs of participating. To meet the grant program requirements, we must open registrations for delegates and exhibitors for all events by the end of February. To do this, we will alter our site allocation process for this year. A single Expression of Interest (EoI) process will be used which will include all three events. The order in which we receive the completed EoI forms will set the order in which we will offer access to sites in each exhibition. We will confirm site allocations with each company later, once the floor plan for each event is finalised. Even if companies wish to participate in only one event, a completed EoI form must be sent back now.

The NSW Government has recently announced the commencement of the **Town Water Risk Reduction Program (TWRRP)**. NSW DPIE are finalising the program's stakeholder advisory panel bringing together key sector stakeholders and trusted experts, enabling them to shape the program's design, engagement approach and strategic direction from an early stage. The panel will include Local Government NSW, the NSW Water Directorate, Joint Organisations, local water utilities, co-regulators (NSW Health, Office of Local Government and the Environment Protection Authority) and DPIE Water's Water Utilities team. A Fact Sheet has been developed which outlines the barriers to be addressed, including skills shortages and inadequate regulatory mechanisms. Water Research Australia (WaterRA) has recently released a *Good Practice Guide to Sanitary Surveys and Operational Monitoring to Support the Assessment and Management of Drinking Water Catchments* (the Guide). The Guide has drawn together and presented current best practice, noted recent innovations, highlighted current research and development activities and predicted future research priorities. The Guide provides worked examples and recommendations of good practice source water sanitary survey methods that make appropriate use of modern technologies. The Guide helps the water sector in its conduct of catchment assessments and observational monitoring under the ADWG Framework and for establishing treatment requirements under HBT approaches. It also provides valuable support for water utilities looking for consistency in the delivery of sanitary surveys as part of their source water assessments to support HBT and other risk assessment objectives. The revised **Certificate IV in Water Industry Operations** has now been endorsed by the Council of Australian Governments (COAG) Skills Council and is available on training.gov.au. Updates include the amalgamation of the Certificate IV in Operations and the Certificate IV in Treatment into a single streamlined qualification to incorporate all the skills required by senior water industry operators. The revised Training Package also includes three new Units of Competency and updated core units and electives, covering contemporary industry practices, new technologies, and operator certification changes in water operations and water treatment. The qualifications have been deemed equivalent to current qualifications, meaning RTOs don't need to reapply to have the qualifications on scope.

On behalf of the Australian Industry and Skills Committee (AISC) the Department of Education, Skills and Employment (DESE) has developed new Case for Change (CfC) templates for 2021 training package update projects. The CfC development process will place greater emphasis on proactive consultation with stakeholders, particularly those in rural and remote areas. **Australian Industry Standards will deliver a webinar** on 11 March 2021 at 1.00pm AEDT to gather industry intelligence and stakeholder input for proposed Water Industry Reference Committee projects. The webinar will provide an overview of the sector as well as challenges and opportunities for skills development. It will also include a Q & A session to enable a broad range of stakeholders to contribute to discussions around future training package development.
