## 2 Water Industry Operator Registration Scheme TRAINING

### EDUCATION

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Undertaking training in accordance with the Water Training Package is referred to as Accredited training. Accredited training must be delivered by Registered Training Organisations (RTOs) who issue Statements of Attainment for individual training units completed. RTO's are the only training providers that can supply Statements of Attainment verifying that an applicant has met the training and competency requirements.

Each individual application must be supported by evidence of completion of accredited training such as Certificates, Statements of Attainment or official student records from an approved RTO. WIOA expects that all documentation supplied will be verified as an accurate copy by the water, wastewater or recycled water business. WIOA will undertake random audits of documentation supplied.

WIOA will automatically recognise Certificate III or higher from the NWP 01 National Water Training Package or any subsequent version of the Training Package. Applicants with qualifications obtained from studies associated with training packages prior to NWP 01 will be required to upgrade their qualification to meet the requirements of the current Training Package (the version applicable on the date application for Registration is made).

## 4 Water Industry Operator Registration Scheme

### WIOA CODE of CONDUCT

This Code of Conduct outlines the standards of behaviour and commitment to excellence that is expected of Registered operational practitioners employed in the water industry.

This Code of Conduct represents a relevant and useful set of guidelines to ensure the profession of a Registered water industry operational practitioner continues to play a vital and ethical role in the operation of the water business.

#### Responsibilities of Registered Operators

Registered operational practitioner should assist in implementing this Code by helping to foster the professionalism of all operational staff within an atmosphere conducive to the promotion of integrity, appropriate behaviour and mutual respect in the workplace.

#### Compliance with Regulations and Protect Public Health

1. Understand and comply with relevant Legislation, Organisational policy, procedures and this Code. If there is any conflict between this Code and Legislation, the provision of the Legislation will prevail.
2. Provide services of the highest quality at all times to ensure the protection of public health and the environment.
3. Serve the public interest and act in a manner which promotes confidence in the integrity of all water industry operational staff.

#### Development of Skills and Pursuit of Best Practice

1. Engage in continuing learning to improve operational competence and extend knowledge and skills.
2. Actively pursue and wherever possible, implement systems which will lead to the attainment of industry best practice.

#### Knowledge Sharing and Mentoring

1. Seek to exchange and share all operational knowledge and skills attained as part of the Registration process and wherever possible, act as a mentor for other non-Registered operators. Adequate training, supervision and instruction of staff are key factors in controlling and managing risks.
2. A Registered operational practitioner has an obligation to take steps to protect their own health and safety and that of their work colleagues, contractors or visitors to a site. They must ensure that staff observes risk management, health, safety, security and personal protective equipment procedures and requirements. Staff must identify and report hazards promptly, and supervisors must ensure risks are eliminated or controlled.
3. Co-operate in every reasonable and proper way with other water industry operational staff.

#### Act in an Ethical Manner at all Times

1. A Registered operational practitioner should not take advantage of their position to influence other staff in the performance of their duties in order to gain undue or improper advantage for themselves or any person or organisation.
2. Uphold high standards of personal integrity and avoid any discriminatory practices.
3. Registered operators need to recognise the professional and ethical dimensions of their work and give proper attention to the values which should guide their decisions and actions.

When faced with a difficult question ask yourself:

- Who needs to be consulted in making this decision?
- Is the decision or conduct lawful?
- Is the decision or conduct in line with the Legislative and organisational principles, including this Code of Conduct?
- What will be the outcome for the staff involved, work colleagues, the water business and its stakeholders?
- Do these outcomes raise a conflict of interest or lead to private gain at public expense?
- Can the decision or conduct be justified in terms of the interests of the water business or its customers?
- Would the action or decision withstand public scrutiny?

### Breaches of the Code

A Registered operational practitioner should be aware that unlawful or unprofessional conduct, even in a private capacity, which damages the reputation of other Registered operational practitioners in the water industry may require disciplinary action.

Serious breaches of this code by a Registered operational practitioner will be deemed misconduct and may lead to disciplinary action.

Any breach of applicable laws, regulations, prevailing business ethics or other aspects of this Code may result in disciplinary action. Such disciplinary action may include (depending on the severity of the breach) reprimand, formal warning, loss of Registration points or termination of Registered status.

### Review of the Code

To maintain the currency and value of this Code it will be reviewed and updated on a regular basis. Registered operational practitioners are invited to submit any suggested amendments to WIOA for consideration.

### Privacy

Information collected by the Water Industry Operators Association of Australia as part of applying for or maintaining Registration will be used for the purposes of general Registration administration, identification, communication, state and national reporting, program monitoring and evaluation. Applicant information will be held securely and disposed of securely when no longer needed.

Details of an individual's current Registration status may be provided to state-based regulators and others acting on their behalf, and will be provided to the employing Drinking Water, Wastewater, or Recycled Water Supplier by official request.

Certified Operators, the Drinking Water, Wastewater or Recycled Water Supplier and the regulatory body responsible for public health in the relevant state or territory can apply to access the relevant personal records for the purpose of validating current competency.

- Documented authority from the Certified Operator will be received prior to the release of any information to any other third party.
- Where information is released to any party, a full record of the information that was supplied shall be maintained by the nominated Certifying Body.
- Relevant state and territory privacy and confidentiality statutory requirements will apply to all applications

### Step 1

- Complete the Registration Application Form - Application Form (1)
- Payment of Registration Application Fee \$110 (inc GST)

- Complete the evidence of fit for purpose training - Training Form (2)

### Step 4

- Sign the WIOA Code of Conduct (4)

  - Seek more information or clarification on the information provided from you or the workplaces most senior technical person responsible for water, wastewater and/or recycled water
  - When all the requirements of the Water Industry Operator Registration Scheme of Water Treatment Operators are met, WIOA will notify both the applicant and the workplaces most senior technical person responsible for water, wastewater and/or recycled water.
