AROUND THE TRAPS

CONFERENCE POSTPONEMENTS

WIOA's primary focus is the safety of our staff, members and stakeholders and doing our part in reducing the spread of COVID in the community. In light of the current COVID situation, and due to the uncertainty around being able to stage business events indoors for some time yet, WIOA has had no choice but to again postpone the **Victorian Water Industry Operations Conference**. It will now be held in Bendigo **on 2 & 3 March 2022**.

Following the postponement of the Victorian conference and to allow adequate time between events, we also advise that the **NSW Conference in Tamworth will be postponed** from the week of 21 March **until 6 & 7 April 2022**. As we see the date changes for both events as another postponement rather than a cancellation, we intend to maintain the same technical presentation programs, floor plan and site allocations with exhibiting companies. The dates and locations for WIOA's other conferences in 2022 have also been confirmed, subject of course to the ongoing situation relating to COVID-19 and any health based restrictions in each State. The **Queensland** Conference will be held at the **Logan** Metro Sports Centre on **3 & 4 August 2022**. The **South Australian** Conference will be held on **20 & 21 September 2022** with the venue to be confirmed shortly.

The WIOA Committee has confirmed that both the **Individual and Corporate Membership fees** for 2022 will remain **unchanged at \$40 and \$300** respectively (both GST included). Although the financial impact of COVID-19 has been dramatic on WIOA with all but one of our conferences cancelled in 2020 and 2021, we are hopeful that events will be able to recommence from early 2022. Membership invoices will be sent to all Members shortly, with payment due on 1 January 2022.

National Water Week kicks off on 18 October with the main theme of caring for water and country. Hosted by the Australian Water Association (AWA), Water Week aims to inspire individuals, communities and organisations to build awareness around the value of water. Access to clean water is hugely important to our daily lives, and it's down to all of us to protect our water environments and resources, and use water wisely. The new Part 11 of the National Industry Guidelines of hydrometric monitoring is now published on the Bureau of Meteorology website at http://www.bom.gov.au/water/standards/niGuidelinesHyd.shtml. This guideline is an international first. It provides guidance for the Australian hydrometric industry on the application of surface velocity methods for velocity and open channel discharge measurements. WaMSTeC endorsed this guideline in August 2021.
